# Background

---

- Alcohol's psychological, cognitive, and motor effects contribute to rape both with perpetrators and victims.
- College men and women were interviewed for this study.

# Results

---

- Levels of aggression was highest when no alcohol was consumed and when a high amount of alcohol was consumed
  - Curvilinear relationship
- Victim's resistance decreased as alcohol was consumed
  - negative linear relationship
