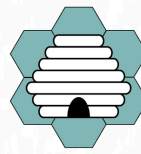

Includes

- the nature of the procedure or intervention
- the risks and benefits of the procedure or intervention
- reasonable alternatives discussed, including their risks and benefits



YOUR BODY, YOUR CHOICE



BODILY AUTONOMY

You decide what happens to your body without coercion, threats or violence.



SELF ADVOCACY

You get to voice your views, needs, interests, or rights.



INFORMATION

You can ask questions until you feel comfortable giving consent.



SAFETY

You get to decide who is in the room during consultation or exam.
